First-Year Experiences (FYEs) 2024 – 2025 First-Year Experience Community Peer Mentor Application

Program Description

The First-Year Experience Community is a year-long course for First-Year and Transfer-Year students that guides them through resources, activities, and discussions designed each term to help students make connections and achieve success in their first year at the University of Oregon. All first-year and transfer-year students opt into their communities but are automatically enrolled when admitted. These communities are more than a resource; they are an experience.

The First-Year Experience Community is within the department of First-Year Programs. First-Year Programs is dedicated to making incoming students' transition to the University of Oregon seamless, substantial, and rewarding by promoting resources and curriculum.

First-Year Programs seek to hire at least three FYE Community Peer Mentors to work as either a First-Year or Transfer Peer Mentor.

First-Year Experience (FYE) Community Peer Mentor Position Description

The First-Year Experience (FYE) Community Peer Mentor role is a year-long position which offers exceptional undergraduate students the opportunity to be leaders and mentors to First-Year and Transfer-Year students participating in the FYE Community. FYE Community Peer Mentors assist in the development, planning, and instruction of the content within the Canvas Community. FYE Peer Mentors organize educational and social opportunities to better acquaint their students with each other, faculty members, and the University of Oregon.

Qualifications

The ideal applicant for this position will be a student who has engaged with the University of Oregon and wants to contribute to a welcoming campus environment. They should be able to demonstrate strong communication and organizational skills. Additionally, this position requires an ability to operate independently and collaboratively in a group setting of student employees and staff. The applicant's collective skills will contribute to punctuality, reliability, and capacity to independently complete assigned tasks. The position of Transfer Peer Mentor requires a UO transfer student. Participation in an FYE during your first year at the University is *not* required.

FYE Community Peer Mentor Responsibilities and Duties

- Mentoring incoming First-Year and Transfer-Year Students
- Meet with First-Year and Transfer-Year Students on a 1:1 basis to support them as they acclimate to campus.
- Connect First-Year and Transfer Year Students to resources on and off campus.
- Develop and execute content for the Canvas Course.
- Monitor and respond to discussion board posts.
- Facilitate and participate in Wellbeing Curriculum.
- Schedule and run at least one event per term
- · Attend weekly team meetings/check-in.
- Host weekly open hours to connect with First-Year and Transfer-Year students. For First-Year Peer
 Mentors, these are referred to as "Snack and Chat" Hours; for Transfer Peer Mentors, these are referred to
 as Transfer Tea and Coffee Hours.
- Represent the First-Year Experience Community at events, public presentations, and tabling, where there
 will be opportunities to inform and connect with First-Year and Transfer Year Students through tabling
 events.
- Communicate in a professional manner, which includes timely responses to inquiries and concerns and making referrals appropriately
- Create a safe and welcoming environment.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Requirements

- Attend and participate in any training programs:
 - o Fall one-day training September 25, 2024
 - o Complete First-Year Program's training modules prior to the Fall one-day training.
- Plan and host the annual Week of Welcome Oregon Hall Open House on September 27, 2024.

Hours and Compensation

- Approximately 6-10 hours per week, with occasional evening and weekend work being required
- Starting at \$16.00/hr
