This FIG will extend the principles discussed in Arch 201 as they are applied in school and in professional practice. This will include having local architects visit the class to discuss professional practice after graduating; opportunities for tutoring in architectural sketching; and opportunities to discuss in detail the various degree arcs at the School of Architecture and Environment.

Introduction to Architecture

This class will introduce the unique purpose of architecture: to accommodate and ennoble the ordinary acts of living, make them poetic, while also aspiring to capture our imagination and to open our lives to the beauty of the world that great architecture always illuminates. By introducing a fundamental body of principles that are essential and archetypal, it will demonstrate how those principles create unique and profound form as they become integrated within a broad range of specific cultures, buildings and physical settings

History of World Architecture

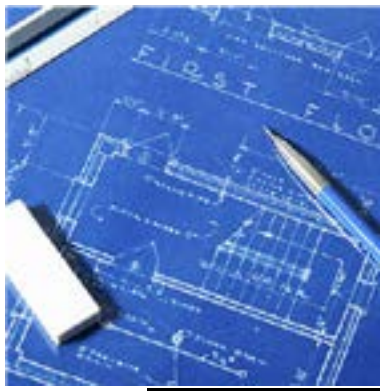
This course will introduce fundamental concepts of western and largely European or international architecture from the Renaissance (c. 1400) to the present. It is designed for those students who are considering more advanced study in art/architectural history as well as for those who want a general understanding of how the built environment engages its surrounding culture. As a Humanities/Art and Letters course, it examines selected buildings to address key historic periods and architectural movements, particularly with respect to how their visual and technical properties have engaged the cultural, economic, and political forces of their day. Consideration will also be given to how the architecture often engaged historic precedent while simultaneously forging new ground. The course has no pre-requisites and is designed for majors from all areas.
