Division of Undergraduate Education and Student Success **College Connections** Tomato, Tomäto explores what we (as members of our society) believe about social and linguistic aspects of personal identity. In Introduction to Sociology, you will learn about how society pushes us to treat certain behaviors as "good/ polite" and others as "bad/rude"; in Language and Power, you will see many of these societal beliefs play out in our beliefs about "good/correct" language versus "bad/incorrect" language (wrong grammar, bad pronunciation, bad words). We will explore the factual basis of many of these beliefs in in an honest and sensitive community that asks hard questions, both of our society and of us as individuals.

Language and Power

This course introduces a new way of looking at language and the relations between people who speak different languages or the same language differently. It explores the implications of linguistic and anthropological findings about language and society and looks at the relationship between language variation (such as accents and dialects) and the social power of speakers of these varieties

Introduction to Sociology

Our study of human society and group life begins with an overview of the tools of sociological inquiry, including theory and methodological reasoning, followed by an overview of human socialization and its role in shaping self-identity. Four additional themes are covered: Crime and Social Control; Social Inequalities Worldwide and by Class, Race, and Gender within the U.S.A.; Dynamics of Social Institutions; and finally, the process of Social Change in an ecologically interconnected, global society. How and why do human groups and societies develop and function? Sociology offers a scientific understanding of human behavior as it relates to and results from interaction within these groups.
