Introduction to Theatre Arts

Theatre has been one of the most effective means through which a society can debate issues of mutual concern, define or modify key values, and explore the potential of the human experience, and it continues to fulfill that role today. By reading and discussing plays, experimenting with aspects of design, observing performances, and writing reviews, each participant can formulate an individual awareness and appreciation of theatre arts in the world today.

Introduction to te Humanities

The ancient humanities continue to exert a powerful creative force on those who come in contact with them, as recent films such as Troy (2004) or Percy Jackson and the Olympians: The Lightning Thief (2010) demonstrate. This course introduces some of the most spectacular works of literature and art that come from the ancient Mesopotamian, Greek, and Roman worlds.
